Door-to-door, via the blue bag only



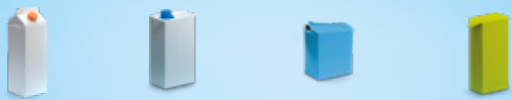
Plastic Packaging

Clear glass



Advice for good recycling



- Separate the clear and coloured glass.
- Empty them well.



- Do not recycle tops, caps or corks in the containers.
- Do not leave anything around or near the collection containers.
- Illicit disposal is subject to penalties.

Coloured glass



Sort paper and cardboard

Via bulk door-to-door collection or sorted separately at the recycling centre

Paper-Cardboard



Advice for good recycling



- Unfold and flatten the cardboard boxes.
- Remove any plastic bits.
- Place them in paper bags or cardboard boxes without using string.
- Remove any plastic around magazines.
- Separate paper and cardboard.

NOT ALLOWED IN PMC



Advice for good recycling



Do not put items inside one another or put filled, tied up bags into the PMD bag.



Do not hang anything on the outside of the bag.



Drain and empty all packaging properly.



Flatten plastic bottles, replace the cap.



Remove the plastic film from the tray and discard them separately in the bag.

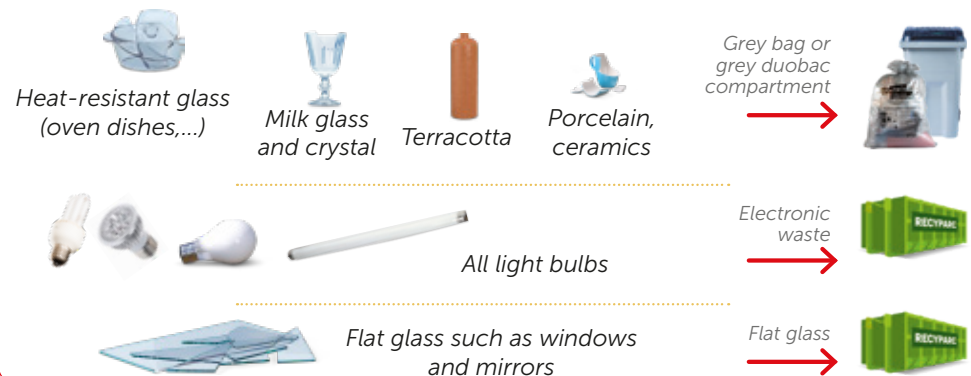


Remove the plastic films that cover the entire bottles and dispose it separately in the blue bag.

NOT ALLOWED IN GLASS COLLECTION CONTAINERS



NOT ALLOWED IN THE PAPER/CARDBOARD



What does the Green Dot logo mean?

The Green Dot logo on packaging indicates that the company that puts the product on the market contributes to the funding of the selective collection, sorting and recycling of household packaging. It does not say anything about the recyclability of the product or its packaging, and it is not a sorting rule.





Separate organic waste

Only door-to-door, separate collection (bag or duobac)
Green compartment of the duobac / Biodegradable communal bag



Biodegradable waste



Food waste



Coffee grounds and tea bags



Wilted flowers and small garden waste



Peelings



Eggshells, nuts, etc.



Paper towels, greasy paper, paper towels

- Separate packaging (trays, plastic film, jars plastic film, containers, etc.) from food that has passed its sell-by-date.
- To limit odour and moisture problems, wrap organic material in old bread bags or newspaper.
- Let air circulate around the biodegradable bag.
- Do not use the biodegradable bag for more than 2 weeks before putting it out for collection.



NOT ALLOWED IN ORGANIC WASTE



Nappies, sanitary towels

Grey bag or grey duobac compartment



Drinks capsules, plastic packaging, etc.

What happens to your organic waste?



Sort your ordinary waste

Only door-to-door, separate collection (bag or duobac)
Grey duobac compartment / Communal bag



Non-recyclable and non-hazardous waste



Aluminium foil



Broken crockery, old light bulbs...



Miscellaneous non-recyclable objects: toys, pens, boots, sandals...



Nappies, sanitary towels, cotton buds...



Dust, Hoover bags, cooled ashes, non-biodegradable litter...

For bags:

- The weight of the bags must not exceed 20 kilos.
- Sharp or pointed objects must be wrapped.



For duobacs:

- Waste may not be packed in opaque bags.
- The lid must be closed.
- Do not compress the waste, it may get stuck and break the partition.
- Do not move the inner wall, it should remain in place.

NOT ALLOWED IN ORDINARY WASTE



Plastic packaging, metal packaging, drinks cartons

Blue bag PMC



Batteries, gas cylinders, packaging for engine oil and lubricants, fuel, pesticides, adhesives, paint and varnish, silicone tubes, packaging with "push down and turn" child safety cap, packaging with at least one of the above pictograms

Electronic devices (vape pens, smartphones, etc.) and all light bulbs

Small gas cylinders (butane)



Batteries

Small electronic devices (mobile phones, headphones, vape pens, etc.)



All light bulbs



Ink cartridges and toners



Do not throw electronic devices or batteries in other waste streams. They can cause fires. Dispose of them in the appropriate stream. If needed, ask your attendant.
